From the Heart of the Shepherd

"Thirsting for Souls"



N THIS third Sunday of Lent, the Church gives us the Gospel of the Woman at the Well. It takes place while Jesus is traveling from Judea to Galilee. It wasn't necessary for him to pass through Samaria to get there, but this is the route Jesus

takes. Our Lord is never just passing through. He goes to Samaria, and remains there two days, because he is always seeking out what is lost. He is always thirsting for souls.

WHAT JESUS SEES

Let's begin by placing ourselves in the shoes of Jesus. He is tired from his journey. He sits down by the well, hungry and thirsty. He ignores the social norms of his time to ask a Samaritan woman to give him a drink. But his thirst and exhaustion don't make him self-focused. He sees the woman in front of him and his deeper thirst is to lead her to "living water" – to show her the love of the Father.

It is noon, the hottest time of the day. The other women of the village come to the well in the cooler hours of early morning and evening, but this woman comes at noon in order to avoid seeing them. Jesus sees in her the anxiety that comes from an unstable life, but also a sincere heart that is open to truth. Her rocky path through life has worn down her façade of pride. She is in search of answers and direction. Jesus sees all of this in her because he sees her soul. He cannot be indifferent to her, or to us. He cannot contain the love that overflows from his Sacred Heart. This is why he came. It is his mission.

WHAT THE WOMAN SEES

The Samaritan woman approaches the well and sees Jesus sitting there. She knows something is different about him the moment she sees him. He looks at her in a way that others don't look at her, with compassion and understanding. And in his glance she sees that he knows her completely. He knows who she is and what she has done,

and yet he is glad to see her. He isn't looking for anything from her. Rather, he wants something for her. She matters to him.

And then our Lord speaks, and asks the woman for a drink. That simple exchange is the beginning of a conversation that will change her life forever. She doesn't understand everything he tells her, but she understands that Jesus knows her. She understands that he cares about her and is interested in her. She understands that for him, she is important. She knows, as if by instinct, that what he says about being the Messiah is true. How else could she explain the change that is already happening in her heart? It is as if a door has opened in her life where before there had only been a heavy, dark, impenetrable wall, protecting her wounded heart. Jesus frees her.

THE RESPONSE OF HER HEART

The fruit of her exchange with our Lord comes naturally, like breathing. The Samaritan woman knows she has found the Savior, and feels compelled to tell everyone in the town. She doesn't give a thought to all the reasons she was avoiding her neighbors. She knows that as soon as they meet Jesus, they will recognize what she has seen. And they do! Jesus stays with them and two days later they are able to say, "We know that this is truly the Savior of the world." [Jn 4: 42]

Our Lord invites each of us to the kind of conversation experienced by the Samaritan woman. Before this day at the well, she just surviving. But after her encounter with Christ she is truly living, and wants to share what she has received with others. She begins to quench the thirst of Christ for souls. Pope Benedict XVI said that to evangelize means "to teach the art of living." Or as our second reading puts it, it is our natural response when the love of God is poured out into our hearts. [See Rom 5: 5] It cannot be held in. Let's ask for the grace to have hearts like the Samaritan woman, that are fully alive and overflowing with love for souls.

SACRAMENTS

Detailed information about Sacraments and Sacramental preparation can be found at onestrongfamily.org/sacraments or by contacting the Parish Center.

BAPTISMS are celebrated on the 3rd Saturday of every month at 10 AM (exceptions for holidays or major parish events). You must register for Baptism at least one month before your desired date. If this is your first child being baptized in the Catholic Church a Baptism preparation class is needed at least two months before the Baptism takes place.

SACRAMENTAL MARRIAGE preparation must begin at least six months prior to your wedding date. Weddings are most often celebrated on Saturdays at 2 PM.

IF YOU KNOW OF A CATHOLIC WHO IS HOMEBOUND and would like to receive weekly Communion or have their confession heard, please contact the Parish Center to learn more about our Homebound Ministry.

RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST: All are welcome to join us in worship at the Church of Saint Mark. Nevertheless, because the Holy Eucharist is the real Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, the reception of Holy Communion is reserved to those Catholics who are in full moral and doctrinal communion with the Catholic Church, are not conscious of any grave unconfessed sin, and who have kept the Eucharistic fast of one hour.

PRO ECCLESIA SANCTA
